Martins Ferry City School District Learning Recovery and Extended Learning Plan K-12

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Purpose: The MFCSD realizes that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, students were not afforded the educational opportunities they would have otherwise participated in in a normal school year. We also realize that students have suffered academically, socially and emotionally as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. For this reason, we will be offering extended learning opportunities for all students in grades K-12. In addition, we will provide an increased number of counselors to help students who have suffered from the stressors of the pandemic. Student data has been assessed to determine where academic loss and gaps have taken place. It is our goal to provide extended learning opportunities that will engage students in all areas of the curriculum in a camp like atmosphere that will entice students to want to participate.

This will be a fluid plan that will constantly be changing as needs arise. Teachers have, and will continue to progress monitor student achievement using a multitude of data points.

As per the MFCSD FY 21 Comprehensive Continuous Improvement Plan (CCIP) the following goals have been set for the district:

- By 2022 English Language Arts scores will increase on Ohio State Testing (OST) by 6% district-wide.
- By 2022 Math scores will increase on Ohio State Testing (OST) by 6% districtwide.
- 80% of all students, in the aggregate and in each subgroup, will increase by 6% in core curriculum on the state assessments by 2022.
- By 2022 chronic absenteeism on the district report card will decrease by 3%.

Staff will continue to create strategies and action steps to assure these goals are met.

The MFCSD Extended Learning plan will begin in June, 2021. Students in grades K-12 will be invited to summer camp based on need. "Camp" will run for four weeks, Monday through Thursday from 9:00 am to noon.

ESSER money will be used to provide this extended learning opportunity.
